MELVIN JONES LIONS INTERNATIONAL MEMORIAL

On Saturday, January 10, 2015, Lions Club International Second Vice President Robert Corlew led us in re-dedicating ourselves in Lionism. It was a bit chilly but his speech gave us much warmth and understanding about Lionism.

2nd V.P. Robert Corlew had the privilege of inducting two Leos into the Safford Leos Club and one Lion into the South Tucson and one into the Tombstone Lions Clubs. Welcome to the new Leos and Lions.

PDG Robin Daviet held a small eye screening with the Boy Scouts and other youngsters who were in attendance.

Let's review some questions that always come up at our Lions re-dedication day in January.....

Question: Why do we always have re-dedication in January when it may be raining, snowing, possibly windy and cold?

Reply: Reason, Melvin Jones birthday is on January 13, and we have been challenged to have his re-dedication on the Saturday closest to January 13.

Question: Why do we have the memorial in Fort Thomas and not in Tucson or Phoenix?

Reply: Melvin T. Jones wanted this Memorial in the Valley where he was born — "Since the Safford Lions Club is the closet club to the birth place, they are accepting responsibility of starting the ball rolling at the State Convention. It is suggested that your delegates to the State Convention in Mesa, on April 14, 15, 16, (Year is unknown) be informed of this and any suggestions that your club might have, be presented at that time". **(This was signed by the Safford Lions Club).** Melvin Jones stated: Ft. Thomas is the place where I was born and have two brothers buried. It is already historical as a Fort, and while Safford is only 18 Miles from Ft. Thomas, Ft. Thomas is only 18 miles from Safford. **Further, the Arizona Lions have already taken action in favor of Ft. Thomas** and no further action is needed, and it should not be brought before the Convention for consideration of another place. It has been suggested and pushed by the Lions of Arizona to have a memorial of some sort for our founder, Melvin T. Jones, who was born at Fort Thomas in Graham County.

Rasheed Afiune Why is Lions Camp Tatiyee Important to Me?

It was my sophomore year of college, I was looking forward to having a job for the summer of 2013, and I wanted to do something that would take me out of my comfort zone. Originally I had gotten a job at Sky Harbor International Airport as a barista at a coffee shop; I was going through the final steps of getting hired when suddenly I got a call from



Arizona Lions Camp Tatiyee letting me know they wanted me to work as a counselor and life guard. I knew that my financial income was going to be higher working at the Airport rather than at camp, but the concept of working with people with disabilities was rare and foreign to me. I can honestly say I was intimidated with the position I was offered, but once again, my goal was to get out of my comfort zone. I believe choosing camp over a job as a barista in a coffee shop has been one of the best decisions of my life.

From my co-workers of Lions Camp Tatiyee I have gathered: the skill of knowing when to be a leader and when to be a follower; the proper manner of addressing issues within staff respectfully and constructively; the importance of receiving constructive criticism calmly and applying them to yourself; the significance of overcoming any type of communications barriers with co-workers as well as with campers; and strong lifelong friendships that only Tatiyee people will understand.

From the campers of Lions Camp Tatiyee I have gathered: experience and exposure to providing care for various people with different disabilities; the knowledge



of culture within groups of people with a disability; respect towards their daily determination to be an independent human being; endless stories, anecdotes, jokes, and joyful memories; and a constant realization and awareness that, every day, I should be grateful and happy for being healthy, but most importantly, alive.

New LCI Initiative will debut right here in Arizona

Arizona Lions will be on the worldwide stage this spring as MD21 rolls out a pilot program for the brand new Lions Global Initiative for Health and Wellness.

LCI has asked the Lions of MD21 to help them launch the new service program that will eventually be implemented throughout the U.S. and around the world. Lion Dr. Mehmet Oz (Dr. Oz) of California has made a substantial financial donation to LCIF to support and help launch this initiative.

The initiative, supported by International President Joe Preston as a worldwide Lions Club project, helps clubs set up health clinics in local communities to screen people for issues like blood pressure, sight, hearing, and belly fat levels. When needed, the clinics also will direct participants to seek medical care.

The goal is to help all people identify and improve their current health status. Additionally, the Global Initiative for Health and Wellness will especially help clubs target populations at or below the poverty line.

MD21 District Governors Bob Jones, Larry Palmer and Bob Bowman voted to endorse the pilot program for the Health and Wellness initiative here in our MD. Internationally, the program will be started here and will roll out in a limited fashion, gradually expanding in scope over time.

Each MD21 District spring convention will feature information and demonstration projects about the initiative so that clubs can begin to plan their own local health clinics. An instructional video of a health clinic in action is being produced and will be available to Lions clubs of Arizona as a guide.

"This is an exciting new community service option for Lions and a real honor for MD21. Plan to attend your district convention to get more information and find out how your club can be part of this pilot project for Lions Clubs International," MD21 Council Chairman Rand Terwilleger suggests.

Attitude plus Action = DOUBLE the Members in Tiny Globe

Try This Formula for Membership Success

Zone Chairman and Globe Secretary, Bobbie Ravenkamp.

Globe Lions Club has been plagued by years of stagnant and decreasing membership - down to just 13 members in July. But something exciting is going on out there and Globe has posted 12 new members so far this year and nearly doubling their membership in just six months.

District Membership Chairman Karen Sell (KSL) asked Zone Chairman and Globe Secretary Bobbie Ravenkamp to share what the club has been doing differently this year.

ZC Bobbie - First we had to change the climate in the club with a new slate of officers and a new attitude. As a club, we recognized that we had to change, we needed to do a better job of accepting new members, and we needed to try some new approaches for getting members.

KSL - But how did you translate a change in attitude into new members?

ZC Bobbie - We took action rather than waiting for prospective members or community needs to come to us.

* We decided we want to be known for being part of the solution so we go out and look for needs - for places where the problem could be an opportunity for service. We don't have all the answers but we know how to tap into resources.

* We started communicating better, emailing minutes, established an e-clubhouse site and a Facebook page. We include our website and Facebook addresses on all correspondence - including the footer of our meeting agenda. Membership Chairman Audrey Opitz texts members to remind them of meetings. News about the club goes to the weekly newspaper each week - and is getting published at least once a month. An information card with the locations of eyeglass boxes is handed out at White Cane and every Lion has a few cards to share with prospective members.

* We are actively seeking alliances with other clubs. We don't want an us-and-them relationship - we want to maximize synergy. We represent the club on community network committees and establish partnerships - ReadOn Globe-Miami, the high school robotics club.

* We developed guidelines for how we would approach potential members.

KLS - What do those guidelines look like?

ZC Bobbie - We use "Ask 1" because it really works. We talk about what we want to do - the impacts we want to have. But beyond that we really are talking about 3 agreements -

1. We (Globe Lions Club) recognize that we have three types of members - Those who pay their dues but have commitments that preclude any regular participation; those who pay their dues and can only participate in projects and occasional meetings; those who pay their dues and have the luxury to participate in many projects and attend most meetings. We agreed that each of these members has value in our club.

2. We project enthusiasm about the core principles of Lionism. We are proud to be Globe Lions and we are proud of our little club's service accomplishments. We emphasize the Lions are 46,000 clubs strong and the world's largest service organization - not a fraternity, not political, not religious - solely service. We emphasize that we are a SERVICE club - not a social club or a club that just signs checks. We emphasize that we do have fun working on our projects.

3. We emphasize that we want to make a difference in our community - that the largest portion of the money we raise in the community stays (eyeglasses, hearing aids, books for children, scholarships) in the community or to support specific state (Camp Tatiyee, Vision Center) or LCI partnered projects (Leader Dogs for the Blind, etc.)

KLS - Is the membership success pretty much the work of one or two dedicated members?

ZC Bobbie - Absolutely not! This is a club effort. As I mentioned, 84 year old Audrey Opitz is a strong proponent of using social media and she is helping other club members get comfortable with texting.

New Lion Kathy Johnson is bringing in three members this month - a family practice doctor and his wife, plus his partner, another doctor. They want to get involved in helping the community and didn't know what or how until Lion Kathy talked to them about why she joined and invited them to attend our meeting with her. They didn't realize the scope and just how much we do and, while their schedules preclude a lot of participation, they want to be part of Globe Lions, too!

And Barbara Nancarrow is one of the proudest new Lions - she has brought in six more new members herself!

KLS - Globe has done an amazing job of bringing in new members this year - would you be willing to help other clubs set their course for this kind of growth?

ZC Bobbie - I would be honored to help!
