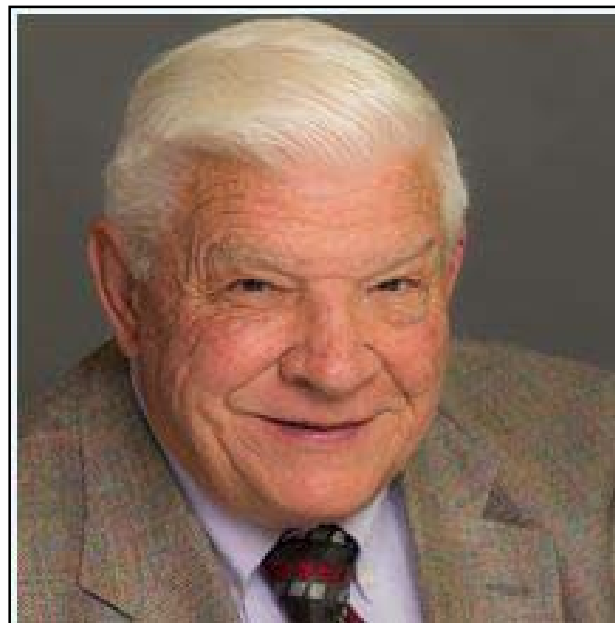

LIONS MD21 GLASSES FOR HOMELESS ADULTS & CHILDREN

The program kicked off on June 1, at St. Vincent de Paul, with several clubs, 3 Midwestern Univ. students, Wendell & Gail DeCross, Marc Paquette and Jeanette Russell in attendance. Most of our Lions signed in clients, distributed readers and visited with clients while Jeanette supervised the program. In just 3 hours, the students screened 79 clients and had to turn many away. More than 50 pair of glasses are being made up at the AZ Lions Vision Center and Jeanette will be delivering them to SVDP later this month. Clients with borderline problems were given readers.

Marc distributed sunglasses donated by the AZ Vision Center and hygiene kits donated by PureTrim, based in Chandler, in the haircut marathon. He visited with many clients and saw, along with Jeanette, the urgency and magnitude of the need to help our homeless brothers and sisters. It's like having a third world country within the boundaries of our own.

I look forward to this wonderful opportunity to attend DG school and meet other Lions from around the world. We are never too old to learn new things and make friends. The Toronto experience will also be enhanced by all 144 Lions from our district supporting Joe Preston (from the Bradshaw Mountain Club – also my home Club) in his election to the office of Lions International President for 2014-2015.

I want to thank all of you for your support as I have risen through the years to become your District Governor and look forward to many more years of helping all those who need Lions support in their disabilities. Always remember our motto "We Serve".

At the right is my DG pin. I have brought back the Kachina which has been used in the past but never goes away as a symbol of our great state. These pins have been a tradition for many years and I have now assembled quite a collection. I hope many of you have also collected them as they will bring back memories of your history as a Lion or Lioness in the future.

I want to acknowledge the time and effort put forth by last years District Governor: Marc Pacquette. Our district had a net gain of 98 members last Lions year surpassing the others in our district by a wide margin.

Include your donation among Charitable Contributions in filing your Federal Tax return.
