LCI Holds Its Fall Board Meeting in Scottsdale

Wow! What a week. I hope that you had the time to help us, with the Host Committee, execute the fall 2014 Lions Clubs International Board meeting that was held at the Phoenician Resort in Scottsdale, October 1st through 8th.

The Host Committee worked for over a year to put together the transportation of the Board from the airport to the hotel, the greeting of all the Board at the hotel, the staffing of a hospitality desk at the hotel during the Board meeting, and of course the Arizona Host Night at the Rockin'R Ranch in Mesa. The results of each of our parts in the execution of the Board meeting proved that the Host Committee did its job and upheld the high standards of the Lions of Arizona.

Sky Harbor is a hard airport to work when you have people coming in over a period of 5 days and on airlines at all 3 terminals, but Chairman PCC Richard O. Brown and his transportation committee did an excellent job in meeting all the dignitaries, helping them to get their bags and getting them rides to the hotel. 44 flights were met from 8 different airlines and 85 guests were transported to the hotel. Terminal commanders PCC Phil and Lion Priscilla Castrovinci, PCC John and Dory Hart, and Lions Bill and Barb Worthington spent many hours in waiting for and then receiving and getting our visiting directors loaded into their transportation and on the way to the hotel.

Once our guests arrived at the hotel, they were met by PCC Carl Johannesen and his hospitality committee where they were once again assisted with their bags and directed to the hotel registration desk. Each guest received an Arizona gift bag with a cowboy bolt man, a bottle of wine from Arizona Lion wine growers, some Lions chocolates, and various other sundries. The hospitality desk was ably supervised by Lions Sandy Phillips and Patty Lacy and others for about 12 hours a day. DG Larry Palmer, PDG Marc Paquette, Lion Elpidio Gabriel, Lion Hans Groot and Lion Dick Gerrick provided shuttle service to those that wished to go into town.

PCC Carl also enlisted our state projects to put up a display daily about their project. All projects participated. Thanks to Arizona Vision Center, Lions Camp Tatiyee, Lions Foundation of Arizona, Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation, and the Melvin Jones Lions International Memorial. Finally, the Board members and their spouses/companions were offered a post-board meeting trip to the Memorial and 67 of them participated in this excursion and hosted by the Memorial Board and the Safford Lions.

What can we say about the Rockin'R Ranch and the job done by PCC Ralph Williamson and his host night crew? We treated our guests to a Wild West evening of an old Western town and going through a cowboy chuck line which was followed by a country show. We were then all treated to the Chartering of three new Campus Clubs in 21C, ASU, Embry Riddle, and NAU and the Mesa Sunland Village Lions Club from 21B by President Joe and the Executive Officers. It was also the first time that many of our off-shore guests had experienced a chuck wagon serving line. Some even said it was reminiscent of their military service. I don't know if those were fond memories or not but the food was great and the companionship incomparable.

Others have also voiced their delight in working with the kids and say that the machines are easy to use.

Lion Carl Watson, Safford, AZ, Lions Club

Carl Watson did not set out to become a Lion. He was involved in a business venture in partnership with the Safford Lions Club that involved providing a stage to rent out for community events. To receive the 501 (c)(3) designation, he found it necessary to be a Lion himself, and so, with some reluctance, he joined in October of 2011.
